If you complete this theme at one of our centres then the practical project may involve working with us to improve the woodlands we care for.

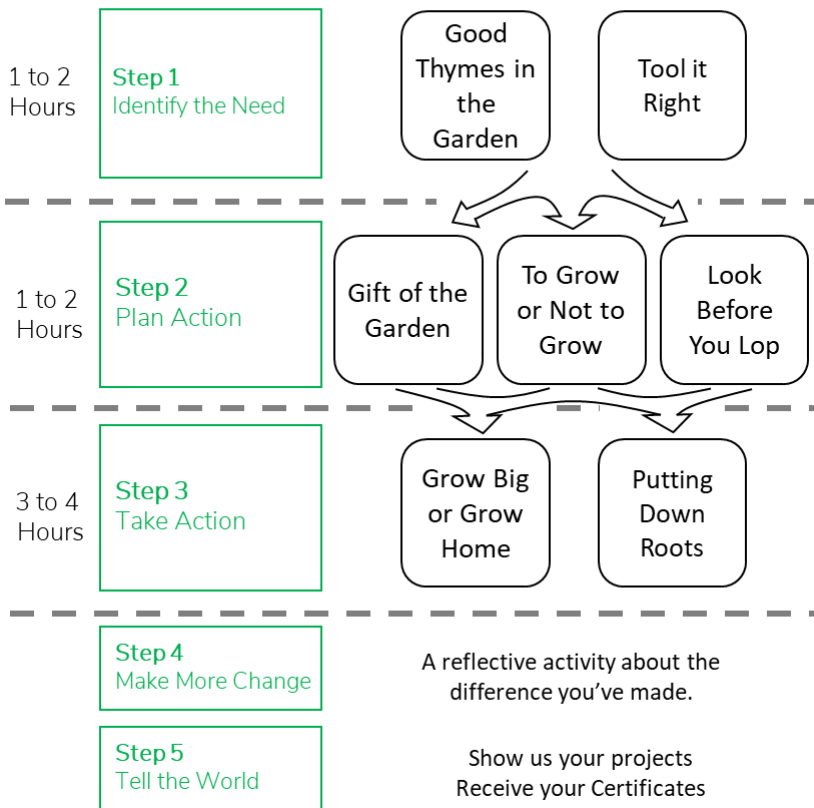
Learning Outcomes
